## MIGRATION NEWS

This year's bumper rainfall came in time to benefit the newborn wildebeest in the South of the Serengeti and will keep providing green grass for the rest of the year. The rains have also had an effect on the route of the migration, with the wildebeest doing a U-turn and coming back to Tanzania instead of moving into Kenya's Maasai Mara.

Tens of thousands of wildebeest are still grazing in the centre of the Serengeti, uncertain whether to move North or West.

This is giving the predators a season of plenty, guests have had spectacular views of cheetah chases, leopards dragging their prey up trees and lions constantly planning hunts.

The northern Serengeti is also very green at the moment making for fantastic photographic opportunities, with plenty of wildlife and virtually no other people.
